RE: Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA)

In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), in the fall of 1988 we Performed Inspections of each of our school buildings for asbestos-containing materials. The inspection finding and asbestos management plans have been on file in each school administrative office since that time.

The EPA requires us to perform re-inspection of the asbestos materials every three years. In 2014, an accredited inspector performed the re-inspections. An accredited management planner reviewed the results of the re-inspections and made recommended actions we should take to safely manage any existing asbestos material in our buildings. In addition to the three year inspection, a periodic assessment is performed by maintenance personnel every 6 (six) months.

All new buildings and additions after the 1992 Bond Issue were built certified asbestos free.

The results of the re-inspections are on file in the management plan in the school's administrative office, the Administration Building, and the Maintenance Office. Everyone is welcome to view these during normal school hours (Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.). RE: Integrated Pest Management Plan

Our school has adopted an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Plan. An IPM Plan is a system in which pests are identified, action thresholds are considered, all possible control options are evaluated, and selected controls are implemented. Control options which include biological, chemical, cultural, manual, and mechanical methods, are used to prevent or remedy unacceptable pest activity. Choice of control options is based on effectiveness, environmental impact, site characteristics, student/staff health and safety, and economics. The goal of an Integrated Pest Management system is to manage pests and the environment, to balance benefits of control, costs, public health, and environmental quality. Integrated Pest Management takes into account site-specific factors and takes advantage of all pest management options. Pesticides shall not be applied unless monitoring indicates pests are present.

If you have any concerns or if your child suffers from severe allergic reactions and would like to be notified 24 hours prior to any pesticide spraying, please contact the principal at your child's school.
